FFI New Terminology

In August 2016, in an effort to validate what it thought it was observing in how the world communicates, FFI invested in global market research where language – ie, the words FFI uses to describe its mission, among other things – was tested in eight countries. In order to ensure unambiguous communication, all respondents took the survey in their native language, whether English, Russian, Chinese, Spanish or German. The feedback unequivocally supported the term "journey" when it came to describing the collective experience of travel and hosting.

So an Exchange is now called a Journey.

The term 'Exchange Director' has been replaced by two new abbreviations:

- An Outbound Journey (formerly Outbound Exchange) will be led by an Ambassador Coordinator (AC).
- An Inbound Exchange will be led by a Host Coordinator (HC).

Gayle Macready – previously our 'Exchange Coordinator' – will in future be our 'Journeys Coordinator.'

So, like it or not, that's the new language we need to get used to.

Trip to Lightning Ridge

I am organising a trip to Lightning Ridge, via St George, for our Garden Club, using Filippos Tours from Stanthorpe. We have used this company before, and they are great.

The trip departs Monday 7th August and returns Thursday 10th August.

Day 1. Depart 7am. Morning tea at Gatton, lunch at Toowoomba, overnight at St George.

Day 2. Arrive at Lightning Ridge for two nights. Tours in afternoon.

Day 3. A day of touring.

Day 4. Depart after breakfast to Collarenebri for morning tea, Moree for lunch, then via Goondiwindi to the Sunshine Coast.

Total cost of this trip is \$765.00 pp twin share. Single \$925 pp. This includes accommodation. all meals (breakfast, morning tea, lunch & dinner) and touring.

There are currently six vacancies, and the cut-off date for bookings is 23rd June. \$200 deposit is required on booking, and the balance two weeks prior to departure.
