Board Decisions

Board Meeting 13th March 2018

- That the President take the necessary action to have the club bag design protected by copyright.
- That the President write a letter to Laurel Dixon expressing the Board's congratulations to Laurel and her committee on the development of the club bag concept and its final design.
- That 100 club bags be ordered at a cost of \$874 including GST.
- That the costs for inbound journey ambassadors include a \$10.00 charge for a club bag.
- That club bags be made available to members at \$10.00 per bag.
- That the Journey Mentor include a statement about club bag costs in the Guidelines for Journey Coordinators.
- That the Journey Mentor include the statement "all financial items for inbound and outbound journeys must be applied to the relevant bank account" in the Guidelines for Journey Coordinators.
- That members be encouraged to wear the club uniform (teal or white shirts and blouses) to meetings which are followed by lunches.
- That the President ask the Principal of Mooloolaba State school if the club banner could be hung on the school fence on meeting days.
- That Judi Gordon hold discussions with Tony Barry regarding a suitable PA system for inside and outside use and report to the next Board meeting.
- That a Journey Development Committee Chair, David Allan be formed to develop a series of themed journeys aimed at attracting early retirees to join, and international clubs to visit.
